Accurate Information is crucial for effective disaster response.


Social media is the most timely and complete source of information and misinformation.




Verily is designed to


- Collect evidence, not opinions
- Crowdsource critical thinking
- Crowdsource evaluation of evidence

Design features

- Have to submit evidence to provide an answer
- Summary "cards" allow fast browsing of questions and of submitted evidence
- Easy to submit evidence
- Encourage asking Fb/Tw friends for evidence
- No "like" buttons
